From the basics to the exceptional—Take your graphics knowledge into a new age.

Changes are well underway in the corrugated industry and have been for the last 12 years. Yet, many facilities are still coming up to speed with the requirements of producing enhanced graphics. While the traditional brown box will always have a place in the market. the images which adorn corrugated containers are becoming quite complex. Consequently, most corrugated printers struggle with how to implement these graphics on their containers. A typical box maker will usually call the suppliers and ask how this can be done. After much discussion, a fingerprint is used to evaluate the box maker's capabilities. information is then used to create the next enhanced graphics job. At this point, most box making facilities, the process comes to a complete halt. The enhanced graphics job at hand has none of the targets or elements from the

finger print incorporated in the layout. Consequently, the facility is lost when the enhanced graphics job will not print as all have envisioned. When this happens, the journey from box maker to printer has begun.

This presentation will cover some of the foundational elements to include on enhanced graphics jobs and tools to include press side for the successful reproduction of enhanced graphics. This entry level presentation is intended for those associated with the preparation or interpretation of flexographic printed materials. Prepress personnel and those wanting to make the transition from press operator to printer are encouraged to attend.
