



The broad theme of this two-day joint Lake States TAPPI and North Central PIMA Fall Meeting and Trade Fair is the "latest" and "best". It is a wide-ranging program that should be of interest to anyone working in the paper industry. Individual presentations were selected for their ability to identify economic issues, innovation and operational improvement opportunities.

Dr. David Ward's keynote address will provide the background and future direction for improving our economic performance. Examples of paper mill revitalization, technologies and practices that increase operating efficiency and control, while reducing energy and capital costs will be covered by other presenters. The current and future impact of nanotechnology and Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) are reviewed. Drs. Ramaswamy and Ring will talk about key pulp and paper program educational and training initiatives. Other leading edge presentations will discuss paper industry logistics and how to get the complete picture of operating costs and model product cost/performance.
